Screening looks for early signs of cancer or pre-cancerous conditions before any symptoms appear. It can help spot cancers at an early stage, when treatment is more likely to be successful and the chances of survival are much better.

- 77497 beneficiaries educated on cancer prevention and to check for the warning signs & symptoms of cancer.
- Out of 21700 screened, 398 beneficiaries had suspicious/precancerous conditions.
- 217 beneficiaries were diagnosed to have cancer. Early detection is saving of life.



## Other Observations

- A camp was also organized at the Headquarters of Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- Radio Talk Shows were held to promote awareness.
- Official Handover on July 27, 2018. Camps started from September 2018 onwards.
- There was a long gap between camps from February 16, 2020 to October 25, 2020, likely due to Covid 19.
